### Organiser & planner's comments

Thank you to all 68 (individuals/groups) listed in the results who turned up for this festive event on the 9<sup>th</sup> Day of Christmas (2/1/2011). We were grateful that after all the preparations the snow had disappeared and we were able to proceed. At the end of a long Christmas break I think we found ourselves competing with the shopping sales, so numbers were slightly down on previous years.

We think the event catered for all, with a mix of the physical demand of visiting up to 27 controls (+ 4 additional ones, shown on small map segments attached to the control) in 60 minutes, using brain power to unlock clues to identify 9 names of sweets/chocolates, and the gifts given by my true love (sweet-heart) on each day up to and on the 9<sup>th</sup> Day O' Christmas.

The Results show that one person did manage to visit all 27 controls and the 4 additional controls: well done Ben Chesters. Ben was also the only one to correctly name all 9 of the sweet/chocolates, so we now know what makes him run so fast. In contrast, 9 people were able to name the gifts given by 'my true love.' The main thing was that people enjoyed their visit to Killerton, and the use of the grounds and the facilities on offer there all helped to make it a great day out. Our thanks go to the National Trust for enabling the event to go ahead.

Finally, as organisers, we would like to thank Roger Green for his efforts in adding an electric fence to the map, and all the controls. Also, Jill contributed to the post-event catering.
